P From the
astor

This Fall we have all seen with great concern the devastation of hurricanes, fires, and earthquakes. Many have sought to help through money given to Lutheran Disaster Response and for that I want to thank you. We also had a great collection for Cottonwood School and for the Pregnancy Service Center. Our God's Work Our Hands Sunday saw our three ELCA congregations come together to work on Baby Kits and School kits for Lutheran World Relief. All this work and time and effort I want to thank you for. You hear me preach every Sunday in some way about looking beyond ourselves to touch the lives of others. These projects are just a few ways in which you do that and that can be lifted up and named, but many times what you are doing individually goes unnamed and unknown. For those things I also want to Thank you. We are called to faith through the gospel and then the gospel compels us to love our neighbor.

This month we have a wonderful opportunity to get to know some our fellow Christians a bit better as St. Elizabeth Ann Sutton Catholic Church and Redeemer Lutheran Church will be holding a joint education event: October 19, 26, and November 2 from 7:00-8:00pm at the St. Elizabeth Parish Hall. This coincides with our jointly remembering the 500 year anniversary of Luther posting his 95 theses on the church door at Wittenberg. This event marks for many a split in our churches over many issues at that time, but also for a great deal of misunderstanding on both sides. Since Pope John XXIII called a council at the Vatican in the 1960s (Vatican II) Lutherans and Catholics have been in dialogue about many of the issues that were raised in the era of the Reformation. This year marks the 50th anniversary of these dialogues. Much has been accomplish by scholars and churchmen and women sitting down and in good faith talking openly about what separates us but more importantly what unites us. There are still some issues of division, but the foundation of who we are in Christ is something that both church bodies proclaim to be unifying.

Our unity in Christ will help us to know each other better but also help us to work with each other better. Catholic Charities and Lutheran Charities are two of the strongest charitable entities in the United States. They seek to help and love their neighbor and both have amazing track records in being fiscally responsible. But beyond that you as individual members of Redeemer Lutheran have probably already been willing to work side by side with your Catholic neighbors. These relationships did not need some Church "Stamp of Approval". They are born of and from God.

So we remember and we do indeed celebrate the Reformation started 500 years ago and more importantly the patience that God has had as we work to understand his love and his longing for us to be one in Christ.

The evening begins with a light Supper, prepared and served by Redeemer volunteers, in the fellowship hall. The meal is free, but donations are accepted.




6:00 - Godly Play for children age 3 through 3rd grade

Oct 1—17th Sunday after Pentecost

[Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32](#)

²³When [Jesus] entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" ²⁴Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. ²⁵Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' ²⁶But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet." ²⁷So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

²⁸What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' ²⁹He answered, 'I will not'; but later he changed his mind and went. ³⁰The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir'; but he did not go. ³¹Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. ³²For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him."

[Jesus said to the people:] ³³Listen to another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a watchtower. Then he leased it to tenants and went to another country. ³⁴When the harvest time had come, he sent his slaves to the tenants to collect his produce. ³⁵But the tenants seized his slaves and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. ³⁶Again he sent other slaves, more than the first; and they treated them in the same way. ³⁷Finally he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' ³⁸But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and get his inheritance.' ³⁹So they seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. ⁴⁰Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to

those tenants?" ⁴¹They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the harvest time."

⁴²Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures:

'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes?'

⁴³Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom. ⁴⁴The one who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; and it will crush anyone on whom it falls."

⁴⁵When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they realized that he was speaking about them. ⁴⁶They wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowds, because they regarded him as a prophet.

¹Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: ²"The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. ³He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. ⁴Again he sent other slaves, saying, 'Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.' ⁵But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, ⁶while the rest seized his slaves, mistreated them, and killed them. ⁷The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. ⁸Then he said to his slaves, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' ¹⁰Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

¹¹"But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, ¹²and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?' 
