Many have spoken how odd it is that this year Easter falls on April 1. It surely has happened before. According to a website <a href="http://tlarsen2.tripod.com/thomaslarsen/">http://tlarsen2.tripod.com/thomaslarsen/</a> easterdates.html, the last time it occurred was in 1956 and will happen again in 2029. April Fool's Day is not perhaps a day we take much stock in. There are some who work out elaborate plans to fool their friends, co-workers, or family members. But often it is a day like any other, except it has the stamp of "foolishness". Easter falls on it so irregularly, because the holiday is set not by the sun but by the moon. But really, it is a wonderful day to consider what God has done for us through Christ. Paul puts it best, I feel.

"<sup>6</sup> For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. In But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation." Romans 5:6-11

This unbounded grace that God shows us is beyond any worldly wisdom. It is indeed foolish, as Paul also says in his first letter to Corinth.

 $^{\mathbf{v}^{18}}$  For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.  $^{\mathbf{19}}$  For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,

and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? <sup>21</sup> For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. <sup>22</sup> For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, <sup>23</sup> but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, <sup>24</sup> but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. <sup>25</sup> For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength." 1 Corinthians 1:18-25

This grace, this love, this mercy that God reveals to us on this "Fool's Day" is our life. The world may say that in our faith we are fools, but we can only boast in how God chose to free not just the wise and obedient, but chose also us, the fools and sinners. So rejoice in God's foolishness, rejoice in God's weakness. Happy Easter.







#### April 1—Easter Day Acts 10:34-43 Psalm 118:1-2, 14-24 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Mark 16:1-8

<sup>1</sup>When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and




anoint [Jesus' body]. <sup>2</sup>And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. <sup>3</sup>They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" 4When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. <sup>5</sup>As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. <sup>6</sup>But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. <sup>7</sup>But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." 8So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." <sup>28</sup>Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" <sup>29</sup>Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

<sup>30</sup>Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. <sup>31</sup>But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his



#### **April 22—4th Sunday of Easter**



I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.

Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. <sup>5</sup>I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. <sup>6</sup>Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. <sup>7</sup>If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."


